Dustin D. Seifert, a native of Lancaster, Ohio, is Chair of the Department of Music, Director of Bands, and Associate Professor of Music at Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU). Professor Seifert received the B.M.Ed., summa cum laude, from The University of Akron and the M.M.Ed. with an emphasis in instrumental conducting from the University of Illinois where he was the recipient of the Guy M. Duker Award. His mentors include Richard L. Cass, Michael R. Golemo, Robert D. Jorgensen, Tucker R. Jolly, James F. Keene, Gary E. Smith, Mark E. Moore, and Deborah A. Confredo.

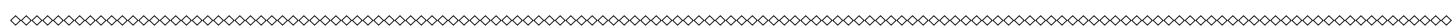
Professor Seifert is responsible for the operation and organization of a comprehensive undergraduate instrumental program. Dustin conducts the Wind Symphony, Symphonic Band, and Greyhound Sound Marching Band, and teaches applied euphonium and tuba. Professor Seifert leads courses in low brass teaching techniques, techniques of marching band, band and wind ensemble history and repertoire, secondary instrumental methods, and beginning and advanced conducting.

Widely honored as a Music Educator and conductor, Professor Seifert was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association in 2022. He received the ENMU "Spirit of Eastern Award" in 2004 and was the 2005 recipient of ENMU's Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching. Dustin has been recognized as a Distinguished Alumnus in Music Education by The University of Akron School of Music and as Music Educator of the Year by the New Mexico Music Educators Association. Prior to his appointment at ENMU, Professor Seifert served as Assistant Director of Bands at Iowa State University (ISU).

Dustin is a member of the New Mexico Music Educators Association, National Band Association, National Association for Music Education, College Band Directors National Association, Texas Music Educators Association, Kappa Delta Pi Education Honorary, and Pi Kappa Lambda Music Honorary. He is an honorary member of national honorary band fraternities Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity.

Professor Seifert was appointed to the New Mexico Music Commission in August of 2020 and currently serves as Southwest Division Chair for the National Band Association, Executive Secretary for the Southeast New Mexico Music Educators Association, is a member of the Collegiate Advisory Council of National Association for Music Education, and served as Music Director of the Clovis (NM) Community Band for eight seasons. He is a Past President of New Mexico Music Educators Association.

Dustin is an active clinician, guest conductor, and adjudicator throughout the region, state, and nation. He has conducted honor bands in Alabama, Alaska, Iowa, Mississippi, New Mexico, Ohio, Oklahoma, and Texas. Dustin and his family are very involved in numerous community service projects. He resides in Portales, New Mexico, with his wife Meredith, son Stratton, and daughter Sawyer Jean.

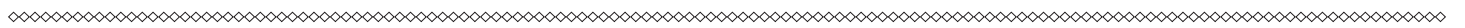
Dr. J. Eric Wilson is Professor of Ensembles and Conducting and has been Director of Bands at Baylor University since 2006. He provides administrative leadership for all aspects of the band program, conducts the Wind Ensemble, and teaches and oversees the undergraduate



and graduate conducting curriculum. Additionally, he has supervised student teachers and served as Chair of the Ensemble Division. Dr. Wilson is a former president of the Big 12 Band Directors Association and Past-President of the CBDNA Southwestern Division. He has been elected into the American Bandmasters Association and the Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity, and honored as Outstanding Professor for Tenured Teaching by Baylor University in 2014.

Dr. Wilson is in demand as a conducting clinician, adjudicator, and performing artist. As a conductor, he has directed numerous regional and state honor bands and conducted his own groups at conventions including the Texas Music Educators Association, College Band Directors National Association, American Bandmasters Association, and The Midwest Clinic. Additionally, he was a featured contributor in the 2015 Meredith Music publication, *Rehearsing the Band*, Volume 2.

Prior to joining the Baylor faculty, he served twelve years on the faculty of Abilene Christian University. Dr. Wilson holds both a Doctor of Musical Arts degree (wind band conducting) and a Master of Music degree (saxophone performance) from the University of Michigan and a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Abilene Christian University. Prior to his university appointments, Dr. Wilson taught in the Texas public school system. In addition to his performing opportunities as conductor, clinician, and saxophonist, Dr. Wilson enjoys spending time with his wife, Lynette, and their children (Blake and his wife, Bailey; Meredith and her husband, Brandon; Luke; and Caleb), and especially loves his new role as Papa with first grandchild, Wesley!

Ron Wilkins, New York City based musician and singer, performs on tenor and bass trombones, euphonium, and tuba. He has performed at the highest levels touring around the world with his own groups as well as premiere artists. Ron is a member of the Grammy Award winning Count Basie Orchestra, the Birdland Big Band, Dizzy Gillespie All-Star Big Band, and runs his own New York City big band alongside trombonist Becca Patterson which features their writing and includes many of New York City's premiere musicians.

Ron has performed with top tier artists, including Ray Charles, Aretha Franklin, Rosemary Clooney, Lena Horne, Bob Hope, Jerry Lewis, Dizzy Gillespie, The Mingus Big Band, The Temptations, Johnny Mathis, Jimmy Heath, Jon Faddis, Eddie Daniels, Randy Brecker, Wycliffe Gordon, and groups such as The Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, Jimmy Heath Big Band, Arturo O' Farrill and his Afro-Latin Jazz Orchestra, The Dizzy Gillespie All-Star Big Band and Small Group, Chris Potter Big Band, Ed Palermo Big Band, Affinity Brass Quintet, Uptown Brass Quintet, Livio Almeida Brazilian Dectet, Memo Acevedo's Building Bridges Band, San Antonio Brass, Capitol of Texas Brass Quintet, San Antonio Symphony and Festival Orchestra, Austin Symphony and Austin Pops, Mid-Texas Symphony, Victoria Symphony, Temple Symphony, and the Flint, Michigan Symphony where he was twice guest artist for their summer pops concert series.

Ron recently recorded a new Concerto (Roncerto) for Bass Trombone, Piano, and four French Horns by dynamic young composer Ethan Gurwitz. This exciting new work is currently available on Apple Music, Spotify, and YouTube. His latest album (Trombocalist) was released in August 2021, and is available at ronwilkins.net and streaming on Apple Music, Spotify, Box.com, and other sites.

Presently, Ron is bass trombonist for the Broadway revival of *Gypsy* on Broadway, and was tenor trombonist of *Funny Girl*. He has played many on and off Broadway touring shows, including "Frozen", "West Side Story", "Wicked", "The Lion King", "Showboat", "The Producers", "Kinky Boots", "Book of Mormon", "Shuffle Along", "Motown", and others. Ron had been a featured artist on bass trombone at the 2018 Dutch Bass Trombone Open in the Netherlands, and jazz artist at the International Trombone Festival in 2002 at the University of North Texas. He is a world-renowned soloist/bandleader performing with his duo, trio, quartet, and quintet across the US, EU, Japan, and Russia. He is a military veteran, having served honorably in the United States Air Force Band Of The West, Lackland AFB in San Antonio.

Ron Wilkins has an extensive background as an educator. He has taught Jazz, Classical, and Latin/Salsa trombone methods at Texas State University in San Marcos, the University of Texas at San Antonio, University of Incarnate Word, Texas Lutheran University, Northwest Vista College, and St. Mary's University in San Antonio. Ron is an S.E. Shires trombone artist and plays his signature line of Greg Black mouthpieces.
